

Objectives for Pupil Premium 2017-18 Grant Expenditure:

Raising Attainment and achievement of pupils through:

- a) Supporting the improvement of numeracy and literacy levels amongst disadvantaged pupils
- b) Providing social and emotional support to improve engagement, attendance and behaviour for learning
- c) Providing access to extra-curricular activities (trips, residential, music lessons, etc.)
- d) Personalising learning - tuition, small group work, boosters, etc.

The **Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)** is additional funding for schools to help support children who are entitled to Free School Meals (FSM). Nationally the attainment data shows that children who are entitled to FSMs underperform when compared to their peers. Funding is available for every pupil who is entitled to free school meals and we are asked to account for how we invest that money in order to improve outcomes.
