AMOUNT AWARDED: £17,490 Sports Premium Funding – 2020-21

The Government has, in recent years, provided Primary schools with an additional grant for improving the participation and attainment of pupils in PE and Sports.

At St Bernadette Catholic Primary School, we were awarded £17,490 for the academic year 2020-21. This funding, which is ring-fenced for investment in sport, is given directly to schools to use as they wish for improving the quality of sport and PE.

Our allocation for 2020-2021: £16,000 & £10 per pupil (£16,000 + £1,490 (149 x 10) = £17, 490)

This is paid as follows: 5/12 of funding allocation paid in June 2019 (April – Aug) 7/12 of funding paid to school in Nov 2019 (Sept-March)

At St Bernadette Catholic Primary School, we have always recognised the positive contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. Last year we were awarded The Gold mark for our participation towards the sports Partnership program.

The Sports Premium has allowed us to raise the profile of sports and healthy living via initiatives such as Sports Week and Healthy Schools week, which have been provided, complete along with visiting specialists, in recent years without cost to parents.

The Premium has also helped us to fund our membership of the local Schools Sports Partnership who organise numerous competitive sporting tournaments for our children to compete at local Cluster and regional events.

Through our subscription to the local Sports Hub partnership, it ensures that all teachers constantly receive the latest guidance in how to deliver well organised and challenging PE lessons which have a positive impact on the children's attainment in PE. It has also helped class teachers to develop their confidence and skills in teaching PE.

It has also enabled us to further increase the number of extra-curricular clubs on offer at our school. The number of extracurricular clubs involving physical activity has increased year on year since 2013. The school now uses Sports premium funding to ensure that all children are offered to attend a sports club throughout their time at St Bernadette School.

We join up with other schools in our cluster to organise mini-tournaments to provide yet further opportunities for inter-school competitive sport for more children.

The Premium has also allowed us to fund Continuing Professional Development of our staff.
