Ash Wednesday

What is Ash Wednesday?

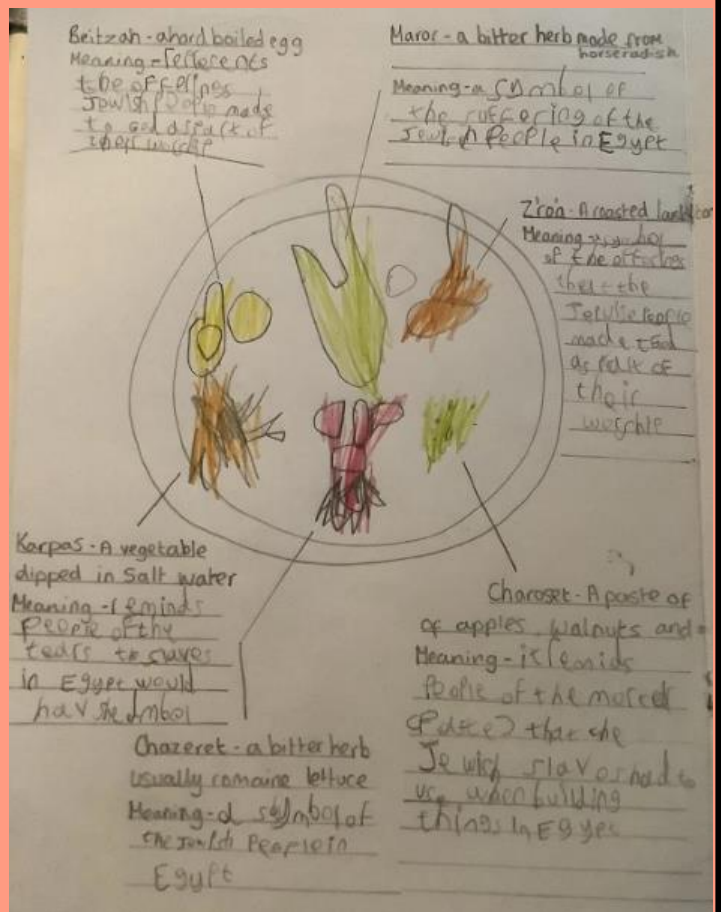
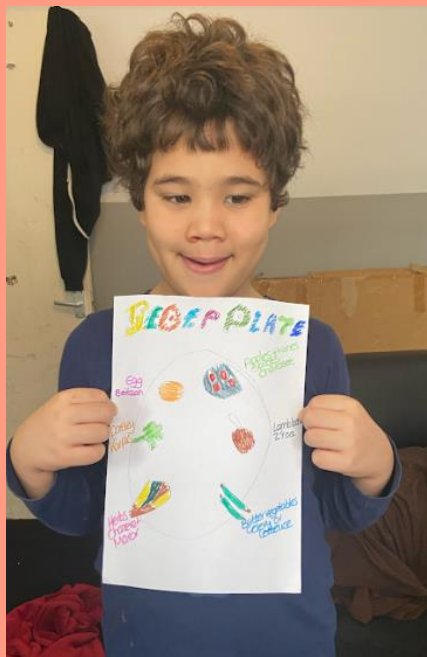
Ash Wednesday is also known as the Day of Ashes

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent. Lent lasts for 40 days and ends on Easter Sunday.

Ash Wednesday is a Christian Holy day of prayer and fasting.

Ash Wednesday happens a day after Shrove Tuesday, which is also called Pancake Day.

Is the beginning of the season of Lent.
We celebrate by fasting for 40 days.
People go to church and make a sign of a cross on your forehead.
Ash Wednesday happens the day after Shrove Tuesday.



Beitzah, a hard boiled egg as a symbol of mourning, and the Jews determined to keep their faith.

Maror, bitter herbs which are often made from horseradish. Like the charoset, they are the symbol of suffering.

Chazeret, Bitter herbs such as romaine lettuce and endive. These represent the bitterness of slavery.

Charoset, A sweet brown paste made of fruit and nuts. This represents the mortar that the Israelites used for building bricks when they were slaves in Egypt.

Z'roa, a lamb that was sacrificed and brought to the temple the night before the Israelites left Egypt.

Karpas, Celery stalks or parsley are dipped into a little bowl of salted water during the seder. Karpas is a symbol of the spring harvest.


The festival is called passover because God's plague went passed the Israelites houses without hurting them because they did what he said and put lambs blood over their doors.

When does Lent start ?

This year 2021 Lent began on Ash Wednesday, it started on Wednesday 17th February and will end on Saturday 3rd April.

How long does Lent last for ?

Lent ends on Easter Saturday, six weeks after it started. In 2021, Easter Saturday falls on Saturday April 3. That is 46 days, although the six Sundays are not included.

What is the tradition of Lent ?

Lent is a season of reflection and preparation before the celebrations of Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent, Christians replicate Jesus Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. Lent is marked by fasting, both from food and festivities.

What do we do ?

If you are a Christian you will give up something that you like or what others like. Such as food or an object. You can go back to that thing as soon as Lent and Easter is over with. It's a good time to try something new that you haven't tried before. We do all this because Jesus spent 40 days and 40 nights in the desert.

EXODUS

The second book of Moses, also known as the second book of the Pentateuch is called "Exodus". The word 'Exodus' means going out or departure, usually of a large number of people.



Exodus 20-40

Once at Mount Sinai, God appears to Moses and gives him the 10 commandments which the Israelites need to obey by. However, many people start having a party and worshipping the golden calf so God kills all

who wanted to be free and not worship God.



God helps Moses part the red sea allowing the people to escape to Mount Sinai. The sea closes again, trapping Pharaoh's army who followed the Israelites wanting to re-capture them.

Exodus 1-2

The Egyptian Pharaoh orders all first born babies of the Israelites to be killed baby Moses is saved by one of the Pharaoh's daughters, who finds him in a basket on the River Nile after he was hidden by his parents.

Moses was raised an Egyptian but later discovers who he really is.



Exodus 3-19

Moses flees from Egypt when he realises that he is in fact an Israelite. 40 yrs later, God appears as a burning bush to Moses and tells him to free his people from the rule of Pharaoh.



Moses goes to confront Pharaoh and asks to let his people go, but Pharaoh refuses. God then sends the 10 plagues upon Egypt and when the 10th plague kills Rameses's son, he decides to set the Israelites free.

A boy who saved us all

An update on the one and only moses!



Moses, an "ordinary" boy (born in the late 14th century BCE) was left in the river Nile by his mum. She had done this to save her child, back in this time of day, the wicked pharaohs had made a rule to kill all baby boys that were Jewish. This was because every boy grew up to become a warrior and the pharaoh didn't want anyone over taking him .

Who would of known that moses had saved all of the Israelites from slavery, he opened up the river to escaped from all the egyptians and managed to live in a desert for 60 years! Lent









Ashes are normally placed on the forehead but this year they were sprinkled on their heads. The ashes symbolize both death and repentance. During this period, Christians show repentance and mourning for their sins, because they believe Christ died for them. The ashes are made from burning the palm leaves from the previous year.

Lent is a period of time for 40 days starting on Ash Wednesday and ends the day before Easter. Lent is a time to fast and give up something for Jesus and what he did for us. Although Easter celebrates the resurrection of Jesus after his death. The colour of lent is purple because purple means royalty. The word lent comes from an old english word lecten. Some symbols of Lent are ashes, sackcloth, penance praying hand, rocks and many more.



The Passover Story: Exodus 12:1-42

 <p>Passover</p> <p>Moses and Aaron, tell the people of Israel that on the tenth day of this month, each man shall take a lamb, one year old, for his family. On the fourteenth day, they shall slaughter the lamb. The blood of the lamb shall be smeared over the doorposts of each household. I will pass over the land of Egypt. If I see the blood, I will pass over you.</p>	 <p>Go and select the animals for your families and slaughter the Passover lamb. Take the blood and put it on the doorposts. None of you shall go out of the door of your house until morning. When the Lord goes through the land to strike down the Egyptians, he will see the blood of the doorposts and will pass over.</p> <p>We will do as you say, Moses.</p>	
<p>Exodus 12:1-11</p> <p>In the deserts of Egypt the Lord told Aaron and Moses that each house must share a lamb and have nothing left over. It is to be roasted and with the blood painted on your door frames.</p>	<p>Exodus 12:12-16</p> <p>When Moses arrived in Egypt he told the Israelites what to do so that the Lord wouldn't kill their firstborn. They were told to not eat bread with yeast in and eat the lamb with herbs.</p>	<p>Exodus 12:17-20</p> <p>On this night the Israelites had the feast of lamb and herbs, spreading the blood on the door frames. They ate unleavened bread and no yeast.</p>
 <p>Make sure to mark the door with lamb blood!</p>		
<p>Exodus 12:21-28</p> <p>The next day they spread the rest blood on the outside of the doorframe to make sure the Lord would pass over them. Meanwhile they prepared for the second feast.</p>	<p>Exodus 12:29-30</p> <p>At twilight the Lord passed over the houses of the Israelites but killed the firstborn of the Egyptians. Meanwhile the Israelites had the second feast.</p>	<p>Exodus 12:37-42</p> <p>A few days later the Israelites travelled from Ramesses to Succoth. They brought unleavened bread with them and livestock followed them.</p>
